Syracuse, N.Y. — Ex-Syracuse running back Delone Carter was released by the Jacksonville Jaguars on Monday.

Carter appeared in one game last season for the Jaguars after spending his first two years with the Indianapolis Colts.

Carter signed with the Jaguars in December after injuries accumulated on their depth chart. He spent time in training camp with the Ravens and Colts last summer before being released before the season.

In July, **Carter was ordered by a court to pay \$40,000 in damages** to a Syracuse alumnus stemming from an incident in 2010 when Carter punched the man in the face.

In 27 career games, Carter rushed for 499 yards and five touchdowns.

The Copley, Ohio, native ranks third on SU's career rushing list with 3,104 yards. He ended his college career with a streak of 242 consecutive carries without a fumble.
